A Part 1 - Starter

Look closely at what the players are doing and write down as many different actions as you can see.

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B Main Activity

Watch the clip again and listen to how the commentators inform the audience about what is happening and capture the excitement and the emotion of the crowd.

Now it's your turn!

Write a short script or paragraph as if you were commentating on the final ball.

Remember a good commentator will keep the audience informed but also use expressive language to make the viewers at home feel as if they are watching the action live at the stadium.

You might want to use a combination of exciting adjectives and powerful verbs to make your commentating interesting to the audience.
